#### General Management and Communication Skills-I Course

The 15 Days full time Course on General Management and Communication Skills-I was introduced in the year 2012 to equip the entrants to the profession with interpersonal and management skills and provide exposure to the contemporary issues in the ever changing socio-economic scenario. Successful completion of GMCS-I course is a regulatory requirement under Regulation 51A/72A of The Chartered Accountants Regulations, 1988.

#### **Objectives:**

The GMCS-I Course aims to equip the entrants to the profession with some essential skills, such as-

- To develop effective communication and presentation skills
- To inculcate business acumen and public relation skills
- To develop all round personality with mature outlook to function effectively in different atmosphere

#### **Eligibility:**

Student who has registered for Articled Training on or after 1<sup>st</sup> May, 2012 and is serving first 12 months of practical training is eligible to undergo the course.

Students, who have undergone existing GMCS Course, can also on their option undergo GMCS-I by paying the required fee.

#### **Duration:**

The duration of the course is 15 days full time. Classes are held for 6 hours each day for 6 days a week (15 days X 6 hours per day = 90 hours).

The suggested allocation of time among the broad areas of the course contents is as follows:

•	General Management	06 Hours
•	Developing Personal Traits	12 Hours
•	<b>Business Communication &amp; Presentation</b>	48 Hours
•	Interpersonal & Negotiation Skills	18 Hours
•	Technical Skills	06 Hours

#### **Teaching Methodology:**

Multiple methods including lectures, case studies, presentations, group discussions, management games, projects, mock interviews etc. should be used. Eminent person of regional/national repute may be invited for interactive sessions.

# The fees shall not exceed Rs.5500/- per student on non-residential basis inclusive of course, study material, tea/refreshment. This fee structure is not applicable for those who undergo the Course at Dubai Overseas Office.

Branches which wish to organize residential GMCS-I Course will follow the same "Session Plan" similar to regular GMCS-I Course. The fee for such programme will be Rs.20,000/- per participant.

## **Exemption for Disabled Students:**

Students, suffering from 50% or above disability of permanent nature are exempted from payment of fee.

The following shall be regarded as disability-

- a. Blindness "Blindness" refers to a condition where a person suffers from any of the following conditions, namely:
  - total absence of sight;
  - visual acuity not exceeding 6/60 or 20/200 (snellen) in the better eye with correcting lenses; or
  - limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of 20 degree or worse.
- b. Low vision "Low vision" means a person with impairment of visual functioning even after treatment or standard refractive correction but who uses or is potentially capable of using vision for the planning or execution of a task with appropriate assistive device.
- c. Leprosy cured "Leprosy cured" means any person who has been cured of leprosy but is suffering from
  - loss of sensation in hands or feet as well as loss of sensation and paresis in the eye and eye-lid but with no manifest deformity;
  - manifest deformity and paresis but having sufficient mobility in their hands and feet to enable them to engage in normal economic activity;
  - extreme physical deformity as well as advanced age which prevents him from undertaking any gainful occupation, and the expression "leprosy cured" shall be constructed accordingly.
- d. Hearing impairment "Hearing impairment" means loss of sixty decibels or more in the better ear in the conversational range of frequencies.
- e. Locomotors disability "Locomotors disability" means disability of the bones, joints or muscles leading to substantial restriction of the movement of the limbs or any form of cerebral palsy.
- f. Permanent and total loss of voice a disabled student has to submit a certificate of suffering from disability, certified by a physician / surgeon / oculist working in a Government hospital, as the case may be.

The Course is organized by the Regional Councils at the Regional Head Quarters and by the Branch at Branch level.
